Welcome to Scottsdale's Annual Native Art Market. The Native Art Market is located within the The Pavilions at Talking Stick Shopping Center. This is on the West side of the Loop-101. Across the freeway from Talking Stick Resort and Casino.

Much like the already successful farmers markets and art walks throughout the metropolitan area, this seasonal event will be a weekly weekend event open from November 2018 through March 2019. The daily hours operating hours are 8am to 3pm on Saturdays, and Sundays. This will be a cultural event created for quick access to the Native American community and culture. All participants must be a of Native American descent. A certificate of Indian Birth is required upon applying. All participants will only showcase and sell Native Handcrafted products. Imitations and imports are strictly prohibited. The event will give Native American families opportunities to generate significant profits through the sale of their products with little overhead.

The goal of the Native Art Walk is to provide a safe and affordable avenue for Native Americans to sell their handcrafted items directly to tourists and local residents. These carefully crafted items include jewelry, clothing, Native cuisine, pottery, sculptures and much more. This program creates a unique opportunity for Native Americans to enhance and develop their economic self-sufficiency. Above all, families involved with the project have gained economic empowerment and pride in themselves. Hundreds of different Native American Artisans will be rotated weekly. Vending days will be sold on a first come, first serve basis once approved for the program.

Native Art Market works in partnership with the The Pavilions at Talking Stick to oversee vendors only provide high quality authentic Native American crafts (**Note: Imitations and imports are strictly prohibited**). Eligibility and Standards

- This is educational and cultural event. All participants must be of Native American descent. A copy of Certificate of Indian Blood will be required upon receiving your application.
- Adult applicants who want minors to exhibit must be present with the minors at the Event. We are currently accepting handmade visual arts such as Photography, Digital Art, Paintings/drawings in all media types. Handmade 3D art made from fiberglass, metal, sculptures, jewelry, crafts, or wood will also be considered.
- Native Art Market selects and approves all participating artists. Artists not approved may not participate in the Native Art Market.
- Artists must arrive at least one hour prior to the start of the Event, be present and show their work throughout the entire Event and tear down at the end of the Event. Native Art Market is not responsible for items left behind. Artists should clean up any trash from their area and place it in designated trash containers.
- Be advised: Jewelry artists spaces sell out quickly.
- Participants will be responsible for obtaining required licenses and authorization for images displayed.
- **All items sold must be native handcrafted. Imports are strictly prohibited.**

Exhibit Spaces

- There are over 300 spaces for hire every month.
- There will be 20-30 vendors set up daily on schedule listed below.
- There will be space sizes available. 10x10 and 6x4.
- 10x10 spaces are allowed to bring White canopies. Each artist selected for large outdoor areas must supply their own 10'x10' white tent, and weights,
- 6x4 spaces are allowed forest green umbrellas. Each artist selected for small 6x4 area must supply their forest green umbrellas and weights.
- Limited White canopy and umbrella rentals will be available. (Detailed information will be in vendor welcome packet).
- Limit one artist per space. For artist collaborations, only one space is provided.
- Each space must be kept clean and in good shape by the artist using it.
- Each artist must bring his or her own displays, such as easels, tables, pedestals, etc.
- Each artist selected for a table space must provide their own table, and display items.

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How To Apply

- Vendor Intake form can be accessed through website www.NativeArtMarket.org/vendor-registration-form or fill out form below
- All artists will need to pay a \$20 juror fee to participate in program. This is non refundable.
- A certificate of Indian Birth is required from all participants and volunteers.
- You will be notified regarding the decision from the Native Art Market.
- Once notified, a password is provided to purchase days online.
- Artists will select dates on a first come first serve basis.
- Artists not accepted into Native Art Market may not participate.
- A vendor welcome package will be sent out with detailed instructions on setup and teardown. rules and regulations.

Fee and Deadlines

- Program Jury Fees: \$20.00. To participate in the current November 2018-March 2017 Event the deadline for the Jury Application is ONE WEEK before that Event is being held on November 2nd, 2018. Jury applications received and accepted after will be eligible for that year's event only if space is available.
- Once accepted into program. Spaces will be 35.00-65.00 a day for 10x10; and 25.00-45.00 a day for 4x6 table.
- Holiday pricing between Thanksgiving and Christmas and special events TBA fee is 65.00 a day for 10x10; and 45.00 a day for 4x6 table. is \$65.00.
- Participants will get to select their weekends to participate as soon as you are registered with program. This is on a first come first serve basis. Days for sign up become available September 8th, 2018.
- Applications will be accepted after deadline. Approved Jurors can start selecting days once approved. So long as they are available.
- Announcements and further information will be sent in Vendor Welcome Packets.
- Each artist is responsible to obtaining required permits from SRPMIC.
- Each artist is responsible to obtain their own insurance.
- Detailed information will be available in your vendor packet.

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HOW TO APPLY:

Vendor Intake form can be accessed through website www.NativeArtMarket.org/vendor-registration-form and pay juror application payment of \$20.00. You can also fill out and return the attached juror application along with your payment of \$20.00. This payment is non refundable and is used to register you for the Native Art Market program. Once registered an approval letter will be sent to you within 1-5 business days. Instructions on how to select vendor spaces online will be noted on email. If internet is not available a list is provided with this application to select days interested in participating. Again days will be sold on a first come first serve basis. To reserve days, payment must be provided for those dates. **All participants must be of Native American descent.**

Attached is the jury application and guidelines. Please include a copy of your Certificate of Indian Birth. This information can be emailed, faxed or mailed in. The payment for your registration can be made online, over the phone, paypal or mail a check/money order made out to "Native Art Market."

Native Art Market and the Pavilions at Talking Stick are not responsible for theft of merchandise.

The Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990 (P.L. 101-644) is a truth-in-advertising law that prohibits misrepresentation in the marketing of Indian arts and crafts products within the United States. It is illegal to offer or display for sale, or sell any art or craft product in a manner that falsely suggests it is Indian produced, an Indian product, or the product of a particular Indian or Indian Tribe or Indian arts and crafts organization, resident within the United States. For a first time violation of the Act, an individual can face civil or criminal penalties up to a \$250,000 fine or a 5-year prison term, or both. If a business violates the Act, it can face civil penalties or can be prosecuted and fined up to \$1,000,000.

Under the Act, an Indian is defined as a member of any federally or officially State recognized Indian Tribe, or an individual certified as an Indian artisan by an Indian Tribe.

The law covers all Indian and Indian-style traditional and contemporary arts and crafts produced after 1935. The Act broadly applies to the marketing of arts and crafts by any person in the United States. Some traditional items frequently copied by non-Indians include Indian-style jewelry, pottery, baskets, carved stone fetishes, woven rugs, kachina dolls, and clothing.

All products must be marketed truthfully regarding the Indian heritage and tribal affiliation of the producers, so as not to mislead the consumer. It is illegal to market an art or craft item using the name of a tribe if a member, or certified Indian artisan, of that tribe did not actually create the art or craft item.

For example, products sold using a sign claiming "Indian Jewelry" would be a violation of the Indian Arts and Crafts Act if the jewelry was produced by someone other than a member, or certified Indian artisan,

of an Indian tribe. Products advertised as "Hopi Jewelry" would be in violation of the Act if they were produced by someone who is not a member, or certified Indian artisan, of the Hopi tribe.

If you purchase an art or craft product represented to you as Indian-made, and you learn that it is not, first contact the dealer to request a refund. If the dealer does not respond to your request, you can also contact your local Better Business Bureau, Chamber of Commerce, and the local District Attorney's office, as you would with any consumer fraud complaint. Second, contact the Indian Arts and Crafts Board with your written complaint regarding violations of the Act.

Before buying Indian arts or crafts at powwows, annual fairs, juried competitions, and other events, check the event requirements on the authenticity of products being offered for sale. Many events list the requirements in newspaper advertisements, promotional flyers, and printed programs. If the event organizers make no statements on compliance with the Act or on the authenticity of Indian arts and crafts offered by participating vendors, you should obtain written certification from the individual vendors that their Indian arts or craftwork were produced by tribal members or by certified Indian artisans.(source: www.doi.gov)
